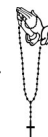



A Reflection: The Holy Gospel Mark 12:38-44

Here in Mark 12, we saw Jesus teaching a crowd of people in the temple and warning them of the scribes. He told them to beware of scribes because they liked attention, position and possessions. And one of the last things He said about them was that they devoured the resources of widows – the most vulnerable people in society. So Jesus, sitting here in the temple, sees two things. First, He sees a lot of rich people giving a lot of money. Then, He sees a poor widow come and give two coins that together would make up a penny. Jesus instantly sees a teaching moment for His disciples. Jesus tells His disciples that the widow put in more than everyone else. Those two little coins were worth more than the hundreds of coins that other people put in. **How? Why?**

"... For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on."

The "widow's might" isn't just measured in money. It can be measured in faith, time, attention, fidelity, devotion, trust and love.

Catechism of the Roman Catholic Church The Sacrament of Penance & Reconciliation

Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he experiences deep contrition, without having first received sacramental absolution, unless he has a grave reason for receiving Communion and there is no possibility of going to confession. Children must go to the sacrament of Penance before receiving Holy Communion for the first time. Without being strictly necessary, confession of everyday faults (venial sins) is nevertheless strongly recommended by the Church. Indeed the regular confession of our venial sins helps us form our conscience, fight against evil tendencies, let ourselves be healed by Christ and progress in the life of the Spirit. By receiving more frequently through this sacrament the gift of the Father's mercy, we are spurred to be merciful as he is merciful.
