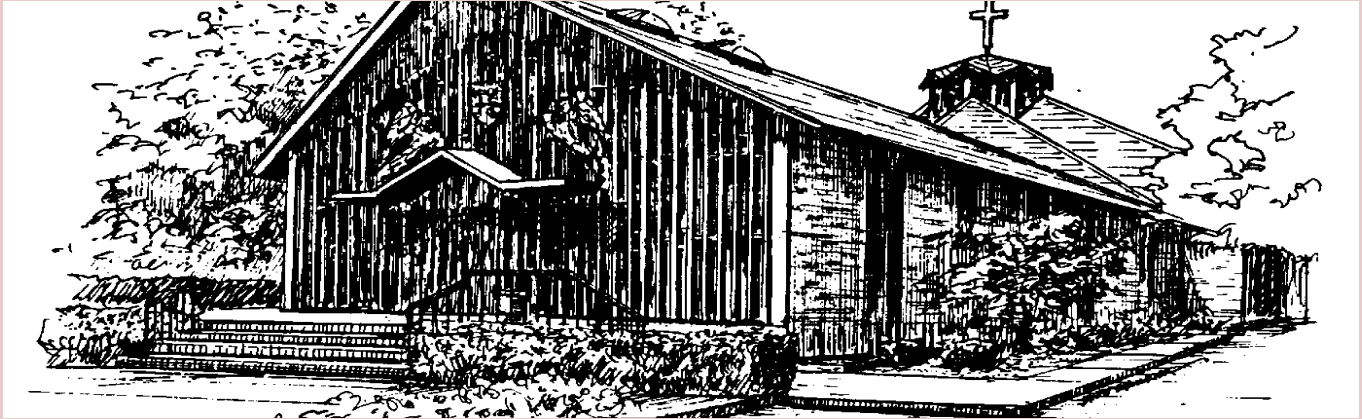

The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ—Mark 14:1-15:47

In today's readings we experience Jesus, as the *suffering servant* who brings God's love to the human family. St. Francis de Sales reminds us that we are called to be like Jesus: The most powerful reason for Jesus' death is to fill the human spirit with **God's love**. Out of death has come life, the wondrous paradox, which the world does not understand. Jesus not only died a cruel death to bring God's love to us, but He also suffered fear, terror, abandonment, and inner depression such as never had and never shall have an equal. He did this so that we too may persevere in pursuing divine love. Jesus' human feelings left his entire heart exposed to sorrow and anguish.

For this reason he cries out:

"My God, why have you forsaken me?"

When have you gone along with the crowd? What will keep you from falling under the spell of a mob mentality?

Celebrate Holy Week; Four special ceremonies commemorate the events of Christ's Passion from His entrance into Jerusalem, when palm branches were placed in His path, through His arrest on Holy Thursday and Crucifixion on Good Friday, to Holy Saturday, the day that Christ's body lay in the tomb. The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

Lent is a journey through the desert to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, as we seek him out, ask his help, join in his suffering, and learn to love like him.

See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious, lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.*"

Let us pray:

God Most High, gracious and glorious, blessed is the one who comes in your name. Lead us now on the road to the cross. May we follow with faithfulness and joy, shouting hosanna in the highest heaven; through Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Amen

WAYS TO MAKE HOLY WEEK MORE MEANINGFUL:

THINK PRAYER. If you have to work or go to school during Holy Week, think about how you can incorporate prayer breaks into each day.

MAKE AN ADDITIONAL SACRIFICE by fasting and abstaining from meat on Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday in addition to Good Friday.

DON'T WATCH TELEVISION from sundown on Holy Thursday until Easter morning...**GO** to confession. **SET ASIDE** 10 minutes every day to read Passion accounts in the Gospels.

Make it a point to **FORGIVE** someone on Good Friday.

PRAY the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary. **PRAY** the Stations of the Cross.

OFFER UP any pain or difficulties you experience during Holy Week and unite your sufferings with the pain of Christ.

INVITE family members, friends and neighbors — especially people who have strayed from the church — to come to church with you.
